The Best Expression of Agrelo's Terroir



The Lamadrid winery is owned by Guillermo García Lamadrid, and the manager and winemaker is Héctor Durigutti. Lamadrid owns three vineyards in Agrelo: Finca La Matilde (planted 1929), Finca Lamadrid (planted 1973), and Finca La Suiza (planted 2004). Each wine comes from one of these Agrelo single vineyards and only indigenous yeasts are used. The remodeled winery combines a unique mix of traditional and cutting-edge winemaking.

The district of Agrelo, in the department of Luján de Cuyo, Mendoza, is called “the land of the Malbec.” This is one of the oldest and most premier growing regions in Argentina. Lamadrid strives to represent the best expression of this beautiful *terroir*.

Lamadrid Malbec Single Vineyard Reserva

91 points ('08), Wine Advocate: “Single vineyard estate fruit; opaque purple; complex aromas, layered, loaded with fruit, rich.”

100% La Suiza vineyard. Malolactic fermentation in oak, and aged for 12 months in first use French and American oak barrels.

Lamadrid Cabernet Sauvignon Single Vineyard Reserva

91 points ('08), Wine Advocate: “Opaque purple; smoke, Asian spices, scorched earth, cassis; complex, lengthy, way over-delivers.”

100% Lamadrid vineyard. Malolactic fermentation in the oak, and aged 14 months in 60% first use and 40% second use French oak barrels.

Lamadrid Bonarda Single Vineyard Reserva

91 points ('08), Wine Advocate: “Single vineyard estate fruit; scorched earth, balsamic, herbs, black fruits, awesome value.”

100% Lamadrid vineyard. Malolactic fermentation in oak, and aged 12 months in first and second use French oak barrels.

Lamadrid Cabernet Franc Single Vineyard Reserva

We strive for an Agrelo terroir-driven Cabernet Franc that is complex with very concentrated fruit.

100% La Suiza vineyard. Malolactic fermentation in the oak, and aged 14 months in 50% first use and 50% second use French oak barrels.

Lamadrid Malbec Gran Reserva

90 points ('05), The Wine Advocate: “An excellent nose of spice box, mineral, black cherry, and blueberry. Medium to full-bodied, it has excellent richness and depth, succulent fruit, and superior length for its price point.” 100% from the La Matilde vineyard. Malolactic fermentation in the oak, and aged for sixteen months in first use French oak barrels.

Lamadrid Malbec Matilde
